

# Structural discrimination and prejudice: a comparative, cumulative and intersectional perspective

EQUALSTRENGTH is a consortium of ten international partners (Utrecht University, University College Dublin, University of Oxford, University of Amsterdam, The German Center for Integration and Migration Research, Vrije Universiteit Brussel, The Budapest Institute, Charles University, The Spanish National Research Council and University of Lausanne), funded through a Horizon Europe grant. The consortium brings together scholars from a broad range of social sciences (e.g., social psychology, sociology, demography, economics, social policy).

The aim of the consortium is to investigate why and to what extent ethnic, racial, and religious minorities are exposed to discriminatory behavior and prejudicial attitudes in multiple life domains (e.g., employment, housing, access to services). Moreover, the project examines whether and how this continuous exposure to prejudice and discrimination accumulates at the intersection of stigmatized identities and across life domains.

The PhD project is embedded in the Work Package “Capturing outgroup prejudices across life domains”. It particularly focuses on attitudes of the majority “in-group” towards minority “out-groups” and will link this attitudinal data with experimental data, that is collected in a nine country cross-national survey including survey/conjoint experiments. The PhD candidate will be involved in designing the survey and analyzing the data for their dissertation. Additionally, the candidate will participate in the Work Package on field experiments and cumulative discrimination.

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
